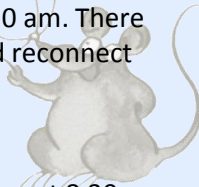

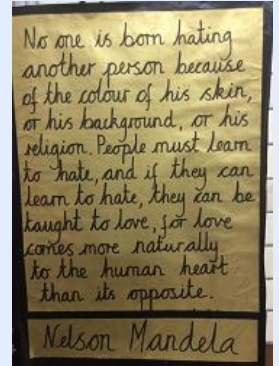


Y5 Latin Club

Letter to Mr Mandela from Leonardo V (Y3H)

Dear Mr Mandela,

It's been a long six months since I last sent you a letter. A lot has happened since then. I have started year 3 at St. John's. My brother moved to Year 5 and my sister is now at Nursery. We had a wonderful summer in Italy by the sea and I thought of you a lot as sitting in your prison cell on Robben Island.

My home life is all good and I am enjoying being a boy of 8, playing with my siblings, friends, learning and just being a young boy. I am sorry you can only receive so few letters as I know there are hundreds of us who want to write to you and are so inspired by you and all that you have done to bring unity to South Africa.

What can I tell you to make you happy? I am a great cook and I am sure you must think about good food being in prison and what that would taste like. I would love to cook for you when you leave prison and my speciality is all things Italian.

I hope this letter brings you some joy. We all pray for your quick release and look forward to you being free. Thank you for making the world a better place.

On Friday 20th November St John's travelled to Hurlingham Park to compete in two fixtures in the Mayors Cup. These games were for our 'B' Teams, teams aimed at giving far greater opportunity to all our KS2 pupils to represent their school at football. Both the Boys 'B' team and the Girls 'B' team played against Fulham Bilingual and St Thomas of Canterbury Schools on the day. The boys faced two very competitive 'A' teams. They more than held their own in both games before eventually finishing second best on both occasions (1-0 and 2-0 respectively). However, this was a great showcase for some pupils to stake a claim to play in the next 'A' team match and for others to gain valuable experience in a competitive environment.

The girls 'B' Team were extremely impressive in their two games against the 'A' teams. After an exciting scoreless draw against Fulham Bilingual the girls faced off against last year's Mayors Cup Semi-Finalists, St Thomas of Canterbury. Having gained confidence and experience from their first games the St John's girls showed tremendous enthusiasm and energy to match their opponents before Hiba eventually won the game late on with a wonderfully struck shot from distance. This result underlines the strength in depth of girl's football at St John's School.
