Please see below our provisional data for Key Stage 2 only. We are pleased with the progress our pupils have made.

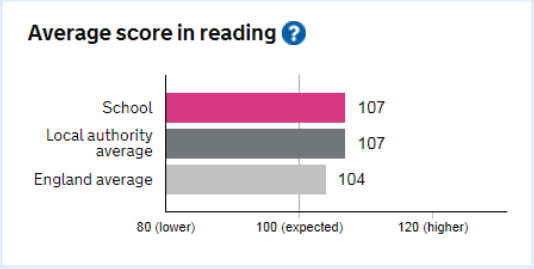
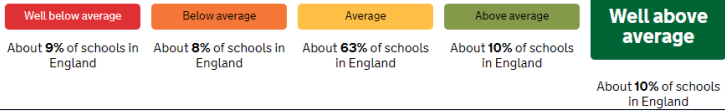
Reading Progress score 2016/2017

Confidence Interval 3.0 to 7.0



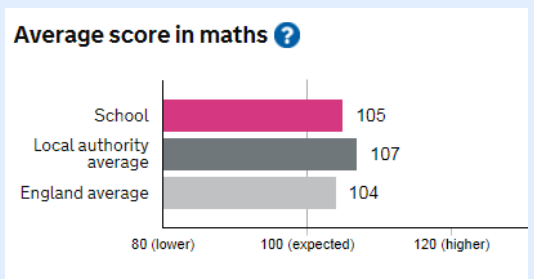
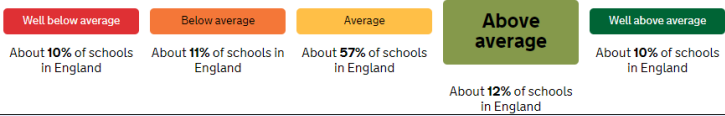
Maths Progress score 2016/2017

Confidence Interval 0.6 to 4.2



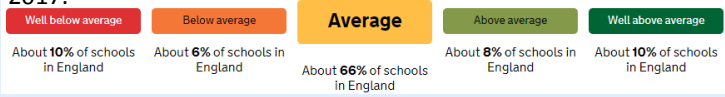
Writing Progress score 2016/2017

The progress of our pupils from KS1 to KS2 in Writing has increased from 2016 results and is at National Average in 2017.

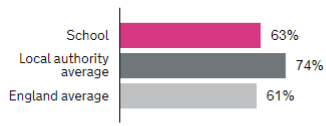
This school's writing progress score is

0.4

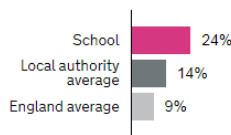
Confidence Interval -1.6 to 2.4
