





We have packed a lot into this very busy week! Both Nursery and Reception began looking at new *Power of Reading* texts; *Bedtime for Monsters* in Nursery and *Stanley's Stick* in Reception.



Our literacy scheme, *Power of Reading*, uses the 'slow reveal' to support children to engage with detailed and high order book talk to understand stories and develop comprehension strategies. To kick off this unit of learning, Nursery were visited by a cheeky monster who left messy footprints all over the classroom! In Reception we have been exploring the play potential of a simple stick using just our imaginations to help us!

It was very special to observe Remembrance Day with our Early Years pupils and we were so impressed with the respect and mature sense of occasion that the children brought to this big topic. Our learning culminated in a trip to the local cenotaph and war graves at Fulham Cemetery. We observed a two minute silence and learnt the story of Anzac biscuits, before getting to taste one for ourselves (or a biscuit very similar!).

Reading Books

All Early Years children will have received a book to read at home this week. Please ensure you have read the accompanying letter that includes information and advice on how to get the most from your child's reading book. Please can we remind you that reading books should be returned to school every **Friday**.

Buggies

We have noticed a number of EYFS pupils being brought to school in buggies. NHS England guidelines state that at this age, children should be doing 180 minutes per day of physical activity, an hour of which should be 'moderate to vigorous'. It is really important that children are encouraged to be active and build up their physical stamina for walking longer distances. Allowing your child to walk or scoot to school will also help your child to develop attitudes of independence and resilience.
