Race Against Extinction

Year 4 are extremely proud to announce that they raised an INCREDIBLE £1,346.76 for the Rainforest Trust with their fun run! The Rainforest Trust have sent the school a framed certificate to commemorate Year 4's amazing work! Year 4 then received amazing news; our INCREDIBLE £1,346.76 was matched by a UK donor and it became an AMAZING £ 2,474, then this amount was matched by a US donor and it became a JAW-DROPPING £4,948 ! A FANTASTIC amount for a very worthy cause. Chris Redston, Executive Director of Rainforest Trust UK, said, "We would like to congratulate all the children in Year 4 for raising such a large amount of money for rainforest protection, and offer our thanks to everyone who donated to this important cause. We have allocated the money to our Rungan River Peat Swamp Project in Borneo, which is home to 4% of the worlds Critically Endangered Bornean Orangutans. The children have saved nearly 3,500 acres of rainforest - the equivalent of about 2,000 football pitches! 


Art Week
