Quadkids Athletic

Pupils from St John's took part in the first Hammersmith and Fulham Event for Quadkids athletics. This is not a new event to St. John's with pupils from our school having represented the borough twice in recent years at the London Youth Games Finals at Crystal Palace. In this competition pupils must complete 4 activities each, Vortex Throw, Standing Long Jump, 75m Sprint and 600m run. This works the same as our intra school athletics assessment (Sportshall Awards) where pupils are rewarded with points for how quickly they run or how far they jump/throw. Our team of 5 boys and 5 girls competed magnificently in an event consisting of 12 other schools from H&F, eventually finishing 2nd by a very narrow margin. With 65 boys and 65 girls competing at the event, individual highlights included Anastasia (Girls 2nd), Ella (Girls 3rd), Bridget (Girls 5th) and Jean-Pierre (Boys 6th).
