Last week, Year 4 were given the task of trying to scientifically investigate which Kitchen Roll brand was 'the best' and to see if adverts are really claiming the truth!

Our investigations looked at the absorbency of each of the four brands: Sainsbury's basics, Thirst Pockets, Plenty or Poundland's Thirsty Bubbles. Our results varied depending on some testing methods, but most tests showed that Plenty was the most absorbent, being able to retain up to 26ml of water.

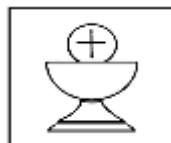
