INFANT AGILITY AND SPORTSHALL FOCUS / HOMEWORK

To give pupils the best opportunity to progress with their Infant Agility and Sportshall Awards we are including a series of PE homework activities to help pupils prepare for the awards. These detail how each activity will be tested during their awards scheme.

Infant Agility Balancer

Balance on one leg, using a partner to get initial balance.

Max 15 seconds per leg & 30 Seconds in total

(one attempt to balance on each leg)

Reception Year 1 Year 2 10 seconds 15 seconds 20 seconds

Sportshall Athletics Balance Test

Balance on one foot (ideally on a beam 4cm wide), bend free leg backwards and hold the foot, gain balance by holding a supporting arm. The watch is started when the participant releases the supporting arm. The watch stops when the participant lets go of their free foot, touches the floor or completes 15 seconds. 2 trials on each leg, 4 trials in total. Max which can be achieved is 15 seconds per trial and 60 seconds in total.

Decathlon points based on total time

15 seconds = 15 points

30 seconds = 30 points

45 seconds = 50 points

60 seconds = 65 points
